

Help Prevent the Spread of the Flu Virus

In Public Places



Disinfect hard surfaces*

- Step 1** For heavily soiled surfaces, clean excess dirt off.
- Step 2** Thoroughly wet surface by using a disinfecting wipe or disinfecting solution in a spray bottle.
- Step 3** Allow disinfecting solution to contact surface for minimum contact time (according to the product label) and rinse if necessary.
- Step 4** If there's excess disinfectant or water, wipe off and air dry.

Disinfect hard floors*

- Step 1** Sweep and pick up excess dirt.
- Step 2** Apply sufficient disinfectant solution so that floor remains wet for the minimum contact time according to the product label.
- Step 3** Mop floor and remove excess disinfecting solution.
- Step 4** Use clean water and a clean mop head to thoroughly rinse floor. Let air dry.

Always use products as directed.
